- Alphabetical list of people and businesses ("white pages")
- classified list of businesses ("yellow pages") ["Buyer's Guide"]
- criss-cross street list (each address in the city listed by *address*) "Directory of Householders" [starting in 1914]
- phone number list [starting in 1969]

The main white pages listing usually includes:

- name
- spouse's name (1928--)
- occupation
- work address
- home address
- race (up to 1870)

Note: the directory was done by canvas in the December of the year preceding, and one could ask to be excluded.

### Ceased publication for Washington DC in 1973.
